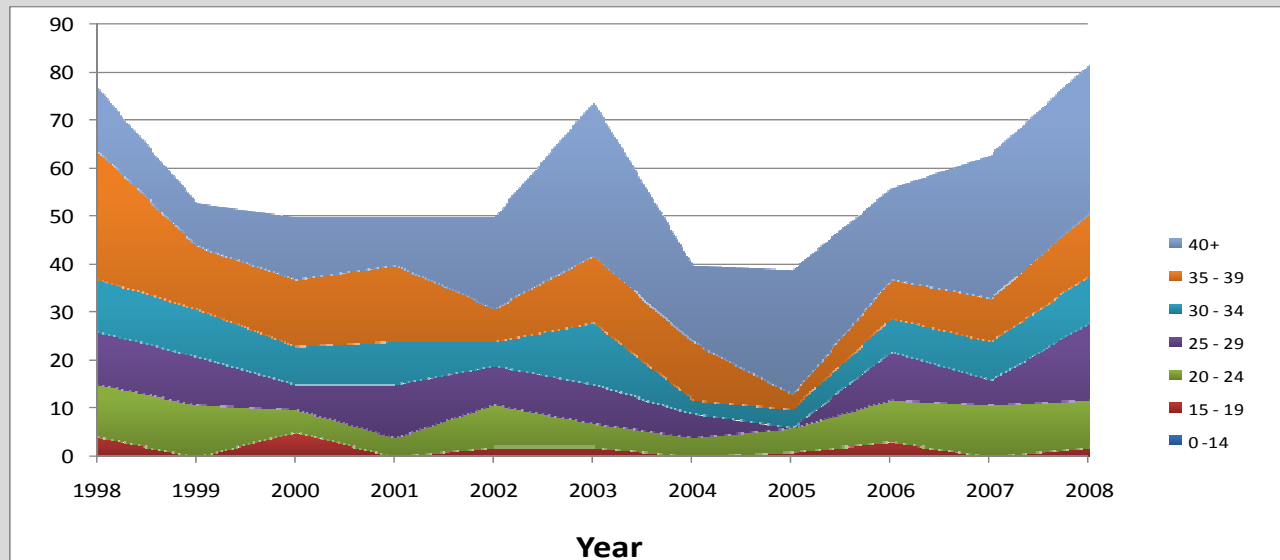
The Grenada Drug Information Network (GRENDIN) Statistical Report of Indicators for the period, 1 January 1998 to 31 December 2008, indicated that **six hundred and thirty-four (634)** persons were sentenced to Prison in Grenada for drug-related offenses. This number comprised of five hundred and eighty-nine (589) males (93%) and forty-five (45) females (7%). Possession of a controlled drug was the main offence committed.

The charts below present information on these persons by gender and age, for the period under review.
