The following is a summary of drug-related data collected by the Grenada Drug Information Network (GREN DIN) for the period 1 January to 31 March 2010.

Number Of Persons Arrested And Charged For Drug-Related Offences:

- Two hundred, and eighteen (218) persons were arrested and charged for drug-related offences. (Males: 195; Females: 23)
- Twenty seven (27) persons twenty years and under were arrested and charged for drug-related offences. (Males: 26; Females: 1)

Number Of Persons Arrested And Charged For Possession Of Drugs Within One Hundred Yards Of Schools:

- One (1) person was arrested and charged for possession of drugs within a radius of 100 yards of a school.

Type And Quantity Of Drugs Seized By The Royal Grenada Police Force:

- Cannabis plants: 69 units
- Marijuana cigarettes: 522 units
- Marijuana: 98.92 kg
- Cocaine: 3 g
- Crack: 205 g

Number Of Criminal Deportees:

- Twelve (12) persons were deported to Grenada for criminal offences. (Males: 10; Females: 2)

Number Of Persons Sentenced to Prisons For Drug-Related Offences:

- Seventeen (17) persons were imprisoned for drug-related offences. (Males: 16; Females: 1)
- Ninety-five (95) percent of persons convicted to prisons for drug-related imprisonment were males and five (5) percent were females.

Number Of Persons Arrested And Charged For Money Laundering Offences:

- No persons were arrested and charged for offences related to money laundering.

Age Range Of Persons Sentenced To Prisons For Drug-Related Offences:

- 15-19 years: 1 person (5.9%)
- 20-24 years: 4 persons (23.5%)
- 25-29 years: 4 persons (23.5%)
- 30-34 years: 2 persons (11.8%)
- 35-39 years: 4 persons (23.5%)
- 40 years and over: 2 persons (11.8%)

Number Of Patients Admitted To Rathdune Psychiatric Unit For Drug Use:

- Ninety (90) persons were admitted to Rathdune Psychiatric Unit for problems associated with the consumption of drugs. (Males: 89; Females: 1)

Number Of Patients Admitted To General Hospital For Drug Use:

- Thirty eight (38) persons were admitted to the General Hospital for problems associated with the consumption of drugs. (Males 34; Females: 4)

Number Of Patients Admitted To Carlton House Treatment Centre For Drug Use:

- Nine (9) persons were admitted to Carlton House Treatment Centre problems associated with the consumption of drugs. (Males: 7; Females: 2)

The Grenada Drug Information Network (**GREN DIN**) is the mechanism through which the Government of Grenada coordinates the collection, analysis and dissemination of statistical information on controlled drugs and related information. It was established in December 2002. The Drug Control Secretariat is the National Observatory on Drugs in Grenada.
